- 4. Acceptance of minutes from special meeting held May 25, 2010
 - a. Futernick motioned that the minutes be approved. Michayluk seconded the motion. Vote: unanimous.
- 5. Sr. Lead Officer Kathy Bennett Not present
- 6. Dept of Neighborhood Empowerment Thomas Soong Not present
- 7. CD12 Councilman Greig Smith's Rep John Bwarie Not present
- 8. Guest Speakers Bill Larsen, Deputy City Attorney advised us about breakin across the street from the mall, people tied up and robbed. Group homes and porn homes continue to be a problem in Northridge. Call Film LA if you did not receive a notice of filming to report illegal filming. Larsen working to amend boarding house ordinance so it will limit how many can live in a house.
- 9. Treasurer's Report Bolin stated nothing to report.
- 10. Committee Reports Outreach and Neighborhood Enhancement committees reported good turn out at Western Bagel and we hope to do this about once a month.
- 11. Public Comments-Comments from the public on non-agenda items within the Board's jurisdiction.
 - a. Teri Grossman requested NWNC expand funding for improving the appearance of blighted Northridge parkways. She said these areas look terrible.
 - b. Debbie Penman requested that the NWNC do something about Tampa parkways that are overgrown with weeds. She complained

the parkways look terrible and she wants NWNC to spend funds to make the parkways look better.

- c. Robert Graf requested NWNC do something about blight along Tampa; the area looks terrible due to overgrown weeds and resulting accumulated trash. Please spend funds to correct the blight.
- d. Chris Williams requests NWNC expend more budget on the blighted parkways in Northridge; those areas look terrible. We cannot keep good people in Northridge and entice good people to come here. Blighted parkways affect our property values and our quality of life.
- e. Donna Schott requested NWNC spend resources to fix blighted Tampa; Northridge parkways look terrible.
- f. Sam DeFrisco addressed Oakridge Estate Park; next meeting is 6/24, 3 pm Fire Station 87, Balboa near Devonshire. Please attend and express your opinion about what should be done with this cityowned property.
- g. Mary Coyle-Engstrom addressed the Northridge Park Theatre Workshop program. She hopes NWNC will provide funding for lighting and sound system. Johnson advised her to prepare and submit a funding request; form is on website.

12. Discussion and possible action items.

- Meg Augello resigned. Gerry Malais had submitted request via email to be considered for At-Large Rep seat which will be up for election 2012.
 Johnson motioned for appointment of Malais. Futernick seconded.
 Vote: Unanimous. Malais took oath and was seated.
- b. Motion by Wilson to spend \$500 to pay Kiwanis Club because Kiwanis paid for this years' Hawaiian Festival security normally paid for by Los Angeles. Johnson postponed this item advising Wilson to bring more information to the July meeting.
- c. Motion by Wilson: DWP MOU Rep to send a letter to DWP General Manager Austin Beutner and to the Board of Water and Power Commissioners President Lee Kanon Alpert objecting to the creation of a Renewable Portfolio Standard / Energy Efficiency Trust Fund without public notice, in violation of the terms of the Neighborhood Council DWP Memorandum of Understanding and demanding that neighborhood councils and the pubic receive at least 90 days' notice of any proposal to further increase the rate for the RPS/EE Trust Fund. Phillips seconded the motion. Vote: Unanimous
- d. Motion by Wilson: Revise Bylaws to change Education Rep to Homeowner Rep. At the May 25 meeting, we decided to change the following 4 seats to At Large: General Business (1), Education Rep (1), Renter Rep (1), Northridge Fashion Center Rep (1). Glen's motion modifies that decision. If Glen Wilson's motion passes, the resulting membership would be as follows:
 - 1 General Business (Johnson 2014),
 - 1 Community/Faith (Wilson 2014),
 - 3 Homeowners (Spurlock 2014, Michayluk 2012 + 1 new open seat expires 2012,),
 - 1 Open-At-Large (Phillips 2012),
 - 2 Seniors (Futernick 2012 and Bloom 2012),
 - 5 At Large (Bolin 2014 + 4 open seats assuming Meg's resignation. Appointed seats 2012) Johnson postponed this motion to July so we can decide if we wish to have 2 General Business seats or just 1.

- e. Motion by JoAnn Phillips regarding the possibility of changes to LA ordinance to shift responsibility for sidewalk repairs and liability onto homeowners. Whereas property owners did not choose and plant the trees causing sidewalks to buckle, and Whereas sidewalks are not private property, and Whereas property owners cannot control use of the sidewalks. Therefore, NWNC hereby requests LA City Council to not shift responsibility for repairs and liability to property owners. Glenn Bailey asked if he may speak on this issue and he was told yes. Mr. Bailey said many other NCs are also approving resolution to object to sidewalk responsibility shift; however, they are also submitting a Community Impact Surveys (CIS) which helps the cause significantly, so he suggests we also do a CIS. Phillips moved to modify this action to include the above resolution and also to submit a CIS. Futernick seconded the motion. Vote: Unanimous
- f. Bolin/Johnson: Contract for webmaster, Rincon, expires in June; we need to decide on contracting with a different firm. We reviewed written proposal and heard a verbal proposal via conference phone call from Aaron DeVandry who would charge \$200 per month flat fee. Aaron manages many other NC websites and many parts of the website should be consistent. Bolin motioned to contract with DeVandry. Phillips seconded. Vote Unanimous.
- g. NWNC FY 10/11 Budget. \$45,000 / \$45k+\$14k rollover=\$59k with Rollover. Chris Williams asked if she may speak on this issue of budget. Pam Bolin said no, only the board can comment. Johnson called for vote and discussion on the following items. Resulting votes shown below. Phillips explained her No vote for many items is due to the pressing issue of blighted parkways throughout Northridge adversely affects the quality of life for all 20,000 constituents throughout Northridge on a daily basis whereas the other budget items are not as pressing and only benefit a fraction of the NWNC constituents. These are budget allocations, not votes for actual expenditures. Proposals to expend such funds may or may not be presented during the fiscal year for vote.
