BASIC NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL MEETING RULES

ALL MEETINGS ARE CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RALPH M. BROWN ACT. The basic council rules listed here are contained either in that act, the governing bylaws of this Council or in rules adopted by the Governing Board.

All Neighborhood Council meeting locations shall be compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

DEFINITION OF STAKEHOLDER: [Bylaws Article 3 (G)] STAKEHOLDER shall mean all persons who live, work, or own property in the neighborhood and also those who declare a stake in the neighborhood and affirm the factual basis for it. The affirmation may require verification of said stake. Furthermore, each stakeholder class within the NWNC's boundaries has the ability to vote and run for office on the board. The geographic area of this council is from the 118 - Simi Valley Freeway south to Nordhoff and Reseda west to Corbin with the centerline of each street as the boundary. (Bylaws Article 5)

AGENDAS – Unless otherwise posted, the Northridge West Neighborhood Council meets the 2nd Tuesday of every month at 7:00 PM at the Beckford Avenue Elementary School Auditorium. The agendas for Neighborhood Council meetings contain a brief general description of those items to be considered at the meetings.

Items on the "Consent Agenda" may be voted on as a group unless a councilmember or stakeholder wishes to be heard on that item. In the event a councilmember or stakeholder wishes to be heard on an item, it will be called special and heard under the "Public Hearing" section of the agenda.

The presence of at least seven Council members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The Council may consider an item not on the agenda only if it is determined by a two-thirds vote of the existing council that the need for action arose after the posting of an Agenda.

 - a. Chris Williams requested to be considered for the open General Business Rep seat. This seat will be up for reelection 2012. Her notary license is within the NWNC area.
 - b. Johnson to present a commendation to Chris Williams for her service to the Northridge area. NWNC thanks Chris Williams for exceptional volunteerism. She expends much of her own time and resources clearing weeds and trash along Tampa, Devonshire, Chatsworth, Corbin, Merridy, etc. Chris sets a great example for all of Northridge residents. She also organizes teams of volunteers.
 - c. Need a volunteer to be NWNC Secretary to prepare agendas, bylaw revisions, resolutions, community impact studies, letters, etc.! Currently minute taker is doing the NWNC minutes.
 - d. NWNC must decide how to budget an increase of \sim \$8,950 extra rollover funds from 2009/2010 FY. This is \$10k minus \$1,050 for past webmaster. Suggestions are: \$800 for new item 6-hour weekend NWNC retreat; add \$800 to Minute Taker fund (\$25/month more than \$100 which is in the budget) plus two possible special meetings; and the remaining about \$7,350 for open discussion on NWNC funding use.

Also: Modify Outreach and Emergency Preparedness budgets to reflect annual budgets, not quarterly budgets, so we have more flexibility. Delete \$2,450 from #400 NPG budget and increase #200 Outreach budget due to Northridge Theatre Workshop funding approved at July 13, 2010 meeting.

A Motion-to-Reconsider can only be made by a Board Member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action. If a Motion-to-Reconsider is not made on the date the action was taken, then a Board Member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a memorandum to the Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforesaid shall be in compliance with the Brown Act.
