BASIC NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL MEETING RULES

ALL MEETINGS ARE CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RALPH M. BROWN ACT AND ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER. The basic council rules listed here are contained either in that act, the governing bylaws of this Council or in rules adopted by the Governing Board.

All Neighborhood Council meeting locations shall be compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

DEFINITION OF STAKEHOLDER: [Bylaws Article 3 (G)] STAKEHOLDER shall mean all persons who live, work, or own property in the neighborhood and also those who declare a stake in the neighborhood and affirm the factual basis for it. The affirmation may require verification of said stake. Furthermore, each stakeholder class within the NWNC's boundaries has the ability to vote and run for office on the board. The geographic area of this council is from the 118 - Simi Valley Freeway south to Nordhoff and Reseda west to Corbin with the centerline of each street as the boundary. (Bylaws Article 5)

AGENDAS – Unless otherwise posted, the Northridge West Neighborhood Council meets the 2nd Tuesday of every month at 7:00 PM at the Beckford Avenue Elementary School Auditorium. The agendas for Neighborhood Council meetings contain a brief general description of those items to be considered at the meetings.

Items on the "Consent Agenda" may be voted on as a group unless a councilmember or stakeholder wishes to be heard on that item. In the event a councilmember or stakeholder wishes to be heard on an item, it will be called special and heard under the "Public Hearing" section of the agenda.

The presence of at least seven Council members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The Council may consider an item not on the agenda only if it is determined by a two-thirds vote of the existing council that the need for action arose after the posting of an Agenda.

COUNCIL DISCUSSION AND TIME LIMITS – Council members requesting to address the Council will be recognized by the Council President in the order requested. A motion calling the "previous question" may be introduced by any member during a Council debate. If adopted, this motion will terminate debate and the Chair will instruct the Secretary to call the roll on the matter.

Other Board Rules will be put in place and this section will be updated as necessary.

Process for Reconsideration – The Board may reconsider and amend actions listed on the agenda if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action or at the next regular meeting. The Board, on either of these two days, shall: 1) make a Motion to Reconsider and, if approved, 2) hear the matter and take an action. If the Motion to Reconsider is to be scheduled at the next meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: 1) a Motion to Reconsider on the described matter and, 2) a Proposed] Action should the Motion to Reconsider be approved. A Motion-to-Reconsider can only be made by a Board Member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action. If a Motion-to-Reconsider is not made on the date the action was taken, then a Board Member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a memorandum to the Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforesaid shall be in compliance with the Brown Act.

- a. Updated presentation by Faramarz Nabavi (The Transit Coalition) on MTA I-405/VAN NUYS RAIL CORRIDOR –Long Term Vision on Phase 1: Sylmar to West L.A. including Sepulveda Pass Tunnel which is partially funded by 30/10 Initiative. The Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) is planning to hold its first round of hearings in the last week of October regarding a transit project that would connect the North and South Valley, and potentially connect the Valley to UCLA, the Westside, and eventually the LAX Airport. (5 minutes)
- b. Discussion and possible resolution to support MTA I-405/VAN NUYS RAIL CORRIDOR Long Term Vision on Phase 1: Sylmar to West L.A. including Sepulveda Pass Tunnel and use resolution that was passed by the Sylmar Neighborhood Council on this topic. (Government Affairs – Wilson)
- c. Motion to renew contract with SK Landscape or lower bidder if one is found to perform maintenance of Tampa Avenue from Plummer Street to Lassen Street on both sides. NWNC approved a 6-month contract ending Dec 16, 2011 for SK Landscape in the last fiscal year. Scope: Tampa Ave. from Plummer to Lassen both sides Work commenced early July 2011. Fund up to \$500 per month for six more months for total up to \$3,000. SK Landscape was lowest bidder. Tropical Creations and SK Landscape provided bids. To be spent on mowing, edging, trash clean up, minor pruning a very heavily traveled area near the mall. Funding from Unallocated Community Improvement. Unallocated Community Improvement was \$12,640 so balance is \$9,640. Beautification (Williams)
- d. Motion to fund a garden project similar to the "Porter Ranch Corner" but at the northwest corner of Wilbur Avenue and Lassen Street now that the owner has provided permission. Up to \$2,200 to G&G Landscape, up to \$500 to a nursery to be determined upon comparing prices, and up to \$500 for lighting via bidding for a total of \$3,200. Carr Landscape and G&G Landscape provided bids. To be spent on excavate weeds and 4 inches of soil, lay weed barrier fabric, install underground drip irrigation system, install 20-30 plants. Funding from Unallocated Community Improvement. Unallocated Community Improvement balance is \$9,640 assuming item a) is approved, so new balance is \$6,440. Beautification (Williams)
- e. Motion to fund a tree planting mostly along west side of Reseda Blvd where there are about 18 empty tree wells and/or dead trees. Also may plant on Tampa Avenue and other streets within NWNC areas. Fund up to \$1,000 for volunteers' materials needed such as trees, soil amendment and printing for flyers & tree posters. Prices will be compared to assure lowest prices are paid. Volunteers will compare Lowes and OSH prices. To be spent on soil amendment, printing of flyers & posters, trees, pruning sealer and Vitamin B-1 to avoid shock. Funding from Unallocated

Community Improvement. Unallocated Community Improvement balance is \$6,440 assuming all items above is approved so new balance is \$5,440. Beautification (Williams)

- f. Motion to fund NWNC Operation Clean Sweep supplies to help the approximately 10 to 12 volunteers to clean up the public parkways for the other 20,000 people living within NWNC areas to enjoy. Fund up to \$1,000 for volunteers' materials needed such as replacement blades, gloves, posters, signs. Prices will be compared to assure lowest prices are paid. Volunteers will compare Lowes, OSH, Kinkos and similar vendors' prices. To be spent on replacement of blades, equipment repairs, posters, gloves, buckets and another tamper for decomposed granite. Funding from Community Improvement. Unallocated Community Improvement balance is \$5440 assuming all items above is approved so new balance is \$4,440. Beautification (Williams)
- g. Motion to fund NWNC Operation Clean Sweep supplies for the approximately 10 to 12 volunteers to clean up the public parkways for the other 20,000 people living within NWNC areas to enjoy. Fund up to \$500 for volunteers' refreshments for the remainder of this fiscal year so they can keep cleaning up the parkways for the other 20,000 people to enjoy. Prices will be compared to assure lowest prices are paid. Volunteers will compare Albertsons, Vons and Smart N Final prices. To be spent on water, coffee and snacks. Funding from Community Improvement. Unallocated Community Improvement balance is \$4,440 assuming all items above is approved so new balance is \$3,940. Beautification (Williams)
- h. Motion to fund a copying service to prepare templates needed for making residential signs. Fund up to \$100 for Kinkos or other vendor to make extra large sized prints to be used with carbon paper to mark the residential names onto the wood so the wood can be routed. Prices will be compared to assure lowest prices are paid. Volunteers will compare Kinkos and similar vendor prices. To be spent on making extra large sized prints to be used with carbon paper to mark onto the wood so the wood can be routed. Funding from Community Improvement. Unallocated Community Improvement balance is \$3,940 assuming all items above are approved, so new balance is \$3,840. Beautification (Williams)
