"Whereas, NWNC voted Yea-8, No-0, Abtain-1 to support CCFO in the							
past, it is imperative to reiterate this support and include more details now that							
the ordinance will soon be considered by LA City Council.							
Whereas, the Community Care Facilities Ordinance is common-sense							
legislation that has been developed to address the proliferation of unlicensed							
nuisance group homes and boarding facilities that have had a huge negative							
impact on single family neighborhoods in Council Member Mitch Englander's							
District in the Northwest San Fernando Valley and in neighborhoods all across the City of Los Angeles. There are a great number of these unlicensed,							
unregulated facilities, most of which are for-profit businesses operating in							
residential areas.							
Whereas, this ordinance is in response to families and neighborhoods in crisis							
who have been terrorized and unable to enjoy the peace and quiet of their own							
homes. Many of them will not even allow their children to play outside on their							
street because there are large groups of rowdy people loitering, drinking and							
smoking, using vulgar language, and harassing neighbors who dare to ask							
them to be respectful.							
Whereas, these facilities generate frequent complaints, often over a period of							
years, of loud parties, drug and alcohol use, fights, excessive trash, public							
urination, heavy traffic and cars parked illegally. The illegal and unlicensed facilities often lack any kind of security, supportive services, and have							
unsanitary and crowded conditions, with up to 40 people in one home.
